It's called Dual Enrollment



Did you know?

Dual Enrollment is where you take college courses at SHS or on the college campus and you earn both high school and college credit for the course.



What about the cost?

Dual Enrollment courses do
not cost you anything!!

That's \$0!!

These courses transfer to any university system
school in the state of Georgia.



Did you know?

At SHS, 10th - 12th grade students can take a variety of core college courses like :

- English 1101 & 1102

- College Algebra

- Psychology

- Economics

- Pre-Calculus

- Public Speaking



Anyone can attend technical school or college after high school. Choices range from Technical School certificate program to College or University degree program.

It's worth checking out!



Types of Postsecondary schools:

Technical School

- Certificate programs – range from a few weeks to 2 years to complete.

Careers that students listed requiring certificate programs:

- Auto Mechanic Construction
- Radiology Tech. Culinary Arts
- Paramedic
- Cosmetologist

College or University

- Degree programs - generally a 2 or 4 year degree.

Careers that students listed requiring a college or university degree:

- Teacher Doctor
- Marine Biologist Registered Nurse
- Veterinarian Lawyer
- Engineer

There are thousands of scholarships granted each year to help students pay for college. In Georgia, we also have the HOPE scholarship!



Did you know?

If you maintain good grades (mostly A's & B's), 3.0 GPA or higher, the HOPE scholarship will pay for most of your college tuition costs.

technical school!

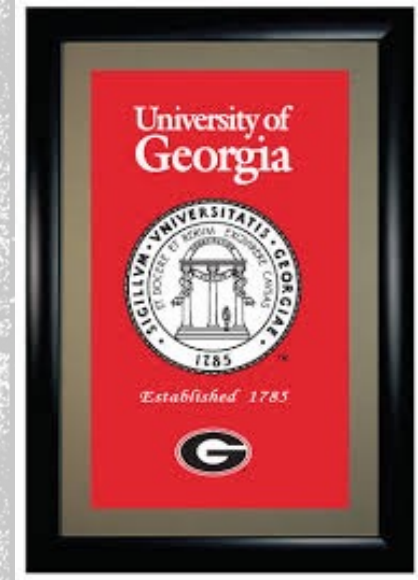
